Guildhall Young Artists King's Cross

Guildhall Young Artists King's Cross (GYAKX) is London's new exciting, vibrant, and accessible performing arts centre offering training in music, drama, and production at the Elizabeth Garrett Anderson School. The centre is part of the Guildhall Young Artists national network of 6 similar centres managed by Guildhall School of Music & Drama and the first to offer training in the three disciplines.

5- to 18-year-olds, from all backgrounds, can access individual lessons and engage in a range of group-based learning experiences to develop rounded creative, social and personal skills. Students have learner-centered timetables and access to creative and musical ensembles under the guidance of professional freelance staff and specialists.

Regardless of their ultimate direction, the professional artistic environment of Guildhall Young Artists King's Cross will offer students with valuable life skills and the means to develop their individual talents to the full. Many of the students across the Guildhall Young Artists network go on to study their chosen discipline full-time at undergraduate level, eventually making careers in the profession, though others can, and do, move into totally different fields.

Purpose of Post

The post-holder will devise, deliver and oversee drama workshops and associated projects to 4-18 year old's and play a key role in designing and evolving a rich, inspiring and ambitious curriculum. This will include:

- Planning, delivering, and overseeing a progressive learning experience allowing advancement in drama.
- Fostering multidisciplinary collaborative practice between drama, music, and production arts.
- Leading the 'Creativity Starts Here' programme for the youngest students and ensuring progression through the development of skills and provision of experiences to prepare students who may wish to study at undergraduate level to be able to do so.
- Devising and directing formal and informal performance work enabling students to put their skills into practice.
- Planning and delivering an inspiring range of enriching activities to complement taught work.



The post-holder will foster positive relations between departments and with colleagues to develop effective professional partnerships and innovative creative working practices. They will be a reflective practitioner who promotes inclusive practice and who is able to communicate effectively and professionally with students, staff and parents, representing the centre positively at all times.

Main Duties & Responsibilities

- 1. To plan, deliver and oversee progressive, curriculum leading drama workshops and projects across the age ranges from Creativity Starts Here through to higher education entry.
- 2. To design and evolve an inspiring and ambitious curriculum which encourages versatility through a range of skills and styles, different repertoire (classical, contemporary, and experimental) and which regular collaborative multidisciplinary practice with music and the production arts.
- 3. To deliver the curriculum through effective and appropriate professional teaching methods.
- 4. To organise and deliver a range of additional events and enriching experiences for students to complement the regular workshops, including but not limited to:
 - regular opportunities to share performance work
 - signposting to appropriate opportunities or training
 - promoting engagement and response as an audience member
 - planning talks and workshops from visiting practitioners; and
 - arranging regular educational visits by students from Guildhall School of Music & Drama.
- 5. To research and provide information and advice regarding access to appropriate higher education courses to students and parents, including signposting to open days, audition workshops, summer schools, transition events and other opportunities.
- 6. To embrace an inclusive learning environment offering personalised pathways for students of all experience and abilities and needs, monitoring to ensure individual welfare and progress.
- 7. To use effective strategies for managing behaviour positively.
- 8. To communicate efficiently and liaise with the Head of Centre, staff and parents as appropriate.
- 9. To source and manage materials and plan and organise events in line with financial and budgeting guidance.
- 10. To oversee resources and spaces and ensure they are well looked maintained.
- 11. To safeguard health and safety at all times and promote good practice to students.
- 12. To follow all safeguarding and associated policies.
- 13. To ensure compliance with all other policies and to complete all associated training as required and show a commitment to continued professional development.
